Importance to Space Sustainability

- Increasing number of and diversity in new actors, concurrent with increasing importance of space in daily activities globally
- Stability rests upon reliable and predictable access to space
- Lack of clarity of the cause when satellite capabilities disappear




SWF Handbook for New Actors in Space

 Goal: Create a publication that provides an overview fundamental principles, laws, norms, and best practices for safe, predictable, and responsible activities in space

Two specific audiences:

- Countries developing space programs and/or having to oversee and regulate their first satellites
- Universities and start-up companies
 that are developing/operating satellites

Mega-constellations

- Over 16,000 satellites planned to be launched over the next 10 years
- Huge *space traffic management* concern
- Frequency allocations will be challenging
- Are current standards of end-of-life operations sufficient?



- Space resource utilization
 - Hague Space Resources Working Group
 - Concerns about some nations being left behind
- Rendez-vous and proximity operations
 - Dual-use nature can make intent murky
- Active debris removal
 - Same issue with dual-use



Changing discussion of resiliency

- Interference even theoretical with space assets perceived to be a huge disrupter
 - Space is a crucial part of national security infrastructure, economies, and daily lives
- Heavy emphasis on resiliency of space assets
 - Not just military/government owners/operators worried about this commercial sector getting involved in these discussions
 - Distribution, diversification, disaggregation, proliferation, protection, and deception
 - Changing attitude toward space protection

International approaches to space security

- International diplomatic community uncertain about how to proceed on space stability issues
 - Traditional venues proven ineffective
 - Too state-centric
 - Move toward strengthening norms of responsible behavior, although not without some controversy
- UN Committee on Peaceful Uses of Outer Space's Long-Term Sustainability Guidelines
